


Figure 1 The North Devon Coast AONB




Figure 2 The North Devon Biosphere Reserve




Figure 3 The Special Area of Conservation designation




Figure 4 SSSI units of the Taw Torridge Estuary, Braunton Burrows, Northam Burrows and Fremington Quay Cliffs
