

Horse riding is only permitted on the Tarka Trail between SERVIS (OS Grid ref. SS47806 19235) and MEETH (OS Grid ref. SS54680 07800)

## GUIDANCE FOR HORSE RIDERS ON THE TARKA TRAIL

- The use of the Tarka Trail by horse riders does not create bridleway rights.
- The route extends from the bridleway at Servis to Meeth Halt. Use of the Tarka Trail beyond these points is not permitted.
- The route may only be joined or left at the public highway (or the bridleway at Servis). Other gates and access points may not be used.
- Sorry, but the parking of horse boxes or vehicles used to bring horses to the Tarka Trail is not permitted in Tarka Trail car parks. Unfortunately space is tight.
- Riders should give way to other users of the Tarka Trail.
- All gates across the route should be left in a closed position.
- Cantering or galloping is not permitted.
- Jumps are not to be erected.
- Riding in a group of more than 3 horses is not permitted.
- Hunting or following a hunt is not permitted.
- Lights shall be worn after dark.
- Riders should not be accompanied by a dog or dogs when using the Tarka Trail. Dogs should be under close control at all times while on the trail, and this may not be possible from horse back. Never have a dog on a lead while riding a horse, (or bicycle for that matter).
